Beyond the Summit: Nearby Golf Courses

PGA WEST - Greg Norman Course, TPC Stadium Course, Nicklaus Tournament Course

Norman Course: The only Norman designed golf course in the Coachella Valley. Sporting only 68 acres of lush, manicured turf, 102 white crushed marble bunkers and shark blue water coming into play on 9 holes, this 7,200-yard course offers a truly "Outback" experience that will entice you back time and time again. Resting in a prehistoric ocean bed 40-feet below sea level and surrounded by an immense crescent of terra cotta mountains, the course teems with purple, white, and yellow wildflowers, while the mix of tall and short native grasses produce different shades of green running almost to silver.

Jack Nicklaus Tournament Course: Challenge, beauty and drama permeate every Jack Nicklaus-designed course, and this masterful design is no exception. Around every corner you will find a new challenge, including the rare feature of two island greens. At 7,204 yards long, The Course has a stroke rating of 75.3 and a slope rating of 143. A true ball strikers' golf course, The Nicklaus Tournament along with The Stadium Course is the bi-annual host of the PGA TOUR's final round of Q-School, which is attended by some of the best players in the world.

Stadium Course: Rated one of the "Top 100 Courses in the World" by GOLF Magazine and 4th toughest course in America in Golf Digest's "Top 50 Toughest Courses in America" (2007), there may be no greater challenge or excitement in the game of golf. At 7,300 yards, the TPC Stadium Course has the highest stroke (76.1) and slope (150) ratings of all the courses at PGA WEST®. A Pete Dye golf course, TPC Stadium delivers multiple adrenaline rushes throughout the round. Host to PGA TOUR "Q-School" Finals every other year, PGA TOUR hopefuls must navigate the island green of hole #17, known as Alcatraz, as well as the menacing water-lined 18th. Named "Stadium" thanks to Dye's ingenious plan to sculpt spectator seating into the natural terrain, many historic moments in golf have occurred here, including Lee Trevino's unforgettable hole-in-one on Alcatraz in the 1987 "Skins Game".

Dunes Course: A great test of golf that is truly a way to hone your shot making capabilities. This course is a good trial to warm up for our TPC Stadium Course at PGA WEST. At par-72 this Pete Dye championship course is characterized by rolling Scottish-links-style fairways and thick penalizing rough. A leisurely round is punctuated by fantastic scenery and careful club selection.

Mountain Course: Famed for its unique Pete Dye design, playability and stunning visuals, this ultra-challenging course features pot bunkers and rock formations, as well as incredible elevations of tee boxes and well-bunkered greens. Ascending to the top of the elevated tee box of the signature 16th enables you to fully appreciate the majesty of this course, named one of Golf Magazine's Top 100 You Can Play.

Set against the backdrop of the snow-capped Santa Rosa Mountains, Faldo's vast international experience and passion for strategic design are clearly in evidence at Marriott's Shadow Ridge. In 2011, Golfweek Magazine ranked Shadow Ridge the 19th "Best Course You Can Play in the State of California." Also, Desert Golfer Magazine ranked Shadow Ridge as the #1 Resort Course in 2010.

This 18-hole, par 72 championship Arnold Palmer-designed course offers a variety of tee options, appealing to players at all levels of the game – from novice players to those on the PGA TOUR. The course has rolling terrain with several elevated tees featuring a core design with pine, olive, and pepper-wood trees, offset by flowering bushes, shrubs and pine straw ground cover, all playing off of the surrounding mountains and vistas that are exclusive to the Coachella Valley, to make for an incredibly beautiful golf experience.

Pete Dye Course: This course has all the Pete Dye trademarks ranging from rolling fairways, pot bunkers, hidden pin placements, carries over water and railroad ties, but with a softened approach appealing to all skill levels. Playing at just over 6,700 yards at a par of 70, the Pete Dye Course is just steps-away from the resort's lobby and as such shares the same majestic mountain views.

Gary Player Course: The first and only Gary Player course in the desert is designed for golfers of all levels and preserves and enhances the natural beauty of the desert environment. The course features 20 acres of lakes, four waterfalls and beautiful landscaping. GOLF Magazine praises this remarkable course as being "difficult, well-designed and joyful" and adds that it "may be the best golf course in the Palm Springs area." This course is well suited for golfers of all skill levels and is renowned for its environmentally careful integration with the desert landscape.

Desert Willow Golf Resort is the crown jewel of golfing opportunities in Palm Desert — perhaps the entire desert southwest. Creations of nationally recognized designers Michael Hurdzan, Ph.D.; Dana Frye; and PGA Touring Professional John Cook, Desert Willow was recognized by the prestigious Smithsonian magazine with the honor of a

cover photograph and lauded for its environmentally sensitive design. The integration of design with native plant landscaping, the finest turf, the use of recycled water, and original artworks is the distinctive difference giving cause for such acclaimed attention. This unique combination also attracted the attention of National Geographic Magazine. Recent awards include Golf Digest "Best Places to Play — 4½ Stars"; LA Times "Southern California Top Ten Places to Play; and Palm Springs Life "Best Public Course". The **Firecliff Course**, measuring 7,056 yards, is a true test of skill where golfers must negotiate their way around extensive natural areas, numerous water features, and more than 100 bunkers / waste areas. The **Mountain View Course** provides unmatched scenery and views while allowing for a less demanding golf game. At just under 7,000 yards and half as many bunkers as Firecliff, you will find more water and less trouble during your round while taking more snapshots than chip shots.

Indian Canyons Golf Resort has been a jewel of Palm Springs and the Coachella Valley since 1961. Once a private club named Canyon Country Club, this 36-hole facility was a favorite haunt of Hollywood celebrities like Frank Sinatra, Bob Hope, and Jackie Gleason. Former U.S. Presidents Dwight D. Eisenhower, Lyndon B. Johnson and Ronald Reagan also walked these fairways. The course is set on 550 acres of Native American tribal property. The **North Course** was designed by William F. Bell, son of famed golf course architect William P. Bell. The longer of the two courses at Indian Canyons, the par-72 North plays 6,943 yards and features stunning mountain views and unique, mid-century modern homes, several of which were originally owned by Walt Disney. Of the six water hazards on the course, the most notable is the lake between the 9th and 18th holes that is home to the famous Disney fountain, which to this day shoots water over 100 feet into the air. Set in Palm Springs' "Canyon" district and surrounded on three sides by the San Jacinto mountains, you can count on a pleasant, wind-free round of golf. An entirely different and distinctive round awaits on the **South Course**. In 2004, architect Casey O'Callahan remodeled the 6,582-yard layout with player consultant, LPGA legend Amy Alcott, who has helped make the South an area women's favorite from the 4,878-yard forward tees. This scenic course is home to four ponds and 850 palm trees. Also, 500 Washingtonia Filifera, a cherished tree of the Agua Caliente Native American tribe, are abundant throughout the course. Golfers will particularly enjoy the South's five par 5's to take on during the round.

SilverRock Resort's Arnold Palmer Classic Course was awarded the Top 10 New Golf Courses You Can Play in America in 2005 by Golf Magazine. This challenging 7,578-yard course encompasses over 200 acres with massive native bunkers and stunning water features. Set against the backdrop and natural beauty of the Santa Rosa Mountains, SilverRock is a former home course of the PGA Tour's Bob Hope Classic from 2008-2011. The Clubhouse, which is situated in rocky outcroppings, is a charming renovation of the former working-ranch hacienda.

This 36-hole Palm Springs golf resort features a magnificent 53,000 square-foot clubhouse and is the only facility in California with two courses ranked in the Top 20 "Best Courses You Can Play" by Golf Week Magazine. Golf Channel's popular Big Break series was contested at Indian Wells Golf Resort for its 15th season and showcased the resort's two championship golf courses - Celebrity Course & Players Course. The Celebrity Course is a two-time host to the PGA TOUR's Skins Game. The **Celebrity Course** at Indian Wells Golf Resort near Palm Springs, CA opened to rave reviews in November of 2006. Playability, diversity, and challenge are the highlights of Clive Clark's masterpiece. Remarkable attention to detail, breath-taking mountain vistas, meandering streams, natural flowers, and striking waterfalls are a perfectly conducted orchestra of world-class design providing total enjoyment for players. The **Players Course** opened in

November of 2007. Designed by prominent architect John Fought, the course presents a brilliant contrast to our Celebrity Course. Featuring dynamic bunkering, generous fairway corridors, and undulating topography. The Players Course is aesthetically fascinating and provides a challenge to all types of players.

Designed by acclaimed architect Ted Robinson Sr., the Palm and Valley courses have stood at the apex of golf in the Coachella Valley since they were built in the mid-1980s. Robinson Sr., renowned as the "King of Waterscapes," incorporated 35 acres of sparkling streams, lakes, and cascading waterfalls throughout the courses to create one of the most picturesque settings in the Coachella Valley with a distinct tropical oasis feel. Adding to the visual mastery of Robinson's work, greenside and fairway bunkers lined with railroad ties adjoin several of the water hazards – with breathtaking views of the towering Santa Rosa Mountains providing a majestic backdrop. Additional hallmarks of the two layouts include undulating fairways, multi-tiered greens, and white-sand bunkers.

Famed designer Ted Robinson Sr. applied his philosophy of letting nature take its course in 1995 on the **Resort Course**. This modern desert layout rivals most other desert courses in the valley for its uniqueness, use of natural surroundings, and playability. Ted Robinson and his environmentally friendly concepts are held true with this design. The use of natural draught tolerant desert landscape, reclaimed irrigation, and recycled materials such as used tires for mounding are an intricate part of the Resort. The layout features an island fairway, multiple water features combined with flowers and magnificent views of surrounding mountains. Most noted for its fairness to all golfers, the Resort is just over 6,700 yards, has four sets of tees for various handicaps and can play as short as 5,200 yards. The **Legend Course**, which just celebrated its fiftieth anniversary, is a traditional country club style golf course. Designed by William Francis Bell, known for designing Torrey Pines, La Jolla Country Club and Bermuda Dunes CC along with many other courses in Southern California and across the country.

Desert Dunes Golf Club has received a variety of awards and recognition over the years, including being ranked as one of the Top 30 public golf facilities in the country and rated a Four Star Place to Play by Golf Digest. Host to U.S. Open and PGA Tour qualifying events, this magnificent course will always be part of the rich tradition and history of golf in the Coachella Valley. Thanks to the recent ownership change and a three-year commitment to host the Canadian Professional Tour, Desert Dunes is poised to reclaim its position as one of the truly special properties in this world-renowned golf destination.
